

CHICAGO/TURABIAN STYLE

Chicago and Turabian Styles use footnotes instead of in-text citations to source facts, quotes, and paraphrased material. Select "Insert Footnote" in Google Docs to create a superscript at the end of your clause or sentence and a footnote at the bottom of the page for your citation. Once you have created a footnote for a source, you can use the shortened note format for subsequential citations from the same source. At the end of your paper, list all the sources you referenced in an alphabetical bibliography format.
